#### ASSESSMENT PURPOSE AND APPROACH

- The study of women's political leadership in the Kyrgyz Republic investigated the barriers to and opportunities for expanding women's participation and leadership in the political landscape.
- It used the Women's Political Participation and Leadership (WPPL) Assessment Framework to document women's access to and power in politics along sociocultural, institutional, and individual dimensions.
- The assessment analyzed WPPLthrough the lenses of access and power.
- USAID can use the report's findings to identify priority areas in which its investments are likely to have the greatest impact.

#### **Desk Review**

#### **Key Informant Interviews**

- Fifteen politicians (eight women, seven men)
- Five civil society and media representatives (four women, one by text)
- Four donors and implementing partners (two women, two men)
- Two academics (one woman, one man)
- One man electoral officer
- Three USAID/ Embassy staff (two women, one man)

#### **Barriers**

- Gender norms
- Perceptions of women
- Violence against women in politics and public life (VAWPPL)
- Patriarchy

#### **Opportunities**

Gender quota

"Deputies who came to the [local] council...after the introduction of the quota mechanism are constantly questioned about their achievements and are almost threatened to justify the quota mechanism. Such questions come from journalists, from members of the local community, and even from individual politicians at the national level. At the same time, none of these "evaluators" ever conduct the same assessment of the activities of men MPs." (Former local councilor and civil

society activist, woman)

#### **INDIVIDUAL**

#### Barriers

- Knowledge, skills, and confidence
- Women's competing roles
- Family support
- Women's networks
- Financial assets

"It is more difficult for women to enter and be in politics.

Overall, expectations of others from her are higher, and her expectations of herself are high, tooshe considers whether she has enough skills and whether she can perform well, etc.

While men do not have high expectations of themselves

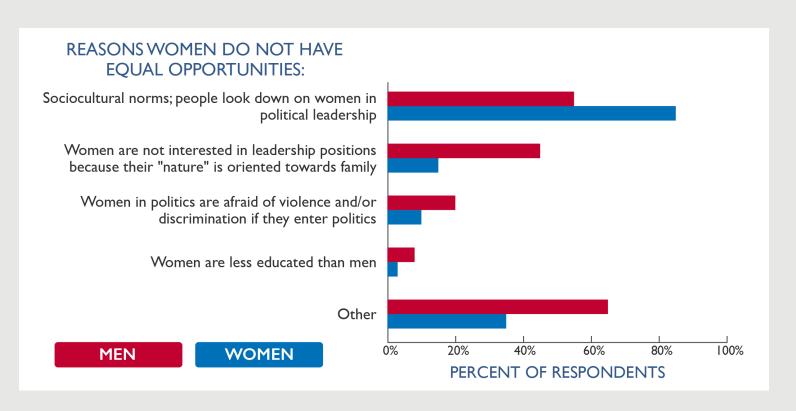

#### SOCIOCULTURAL

- Journalist and media training for gender sensitivity
- Support civil society and media
- Engage men gatekeepers



#### INSTITUTIONAL

- National Gender Strategy (NGS) and gender empowerment goals
- Combat VAWPPL
- Political advocacy to clarify the quota system
- Equal treatment of women candidates
- Opportunities for women politicians to network and caucus

#### **INDIVIDUAL**

- Gvic education
- Capacity and skills among women candidates and politicians
- Train women politicians in media skills
- Training and orientation for women councilors
